




Why ELOM?

We implement the Do More Foundation's (DMF) basket of services for their *Young Child Programme* in uPhongolo.

DMF wanted to know the developmental performance on the ELOM of 4-and-5-year-olds enrolled in early learning programmes in the municipality.

A **dipstick** study was chosen for the end of the school year.

ELOM is increasing seen as the gold standard when assessing young children – ethical, locally relevant, and reliable.

What we learnt – the results

What we learnt - the process



As a first-time user

Talk to the DATA DRIVE team and others who have used ELOM.

Use the DATA DRIVE website to immerse yourself in the tools, the steps.

Be clear about why you are doing the assessment and what data you want.

Find an assessor you have confidence in.

Understand age ranges, use the Age Calculator and select the sample carefully.

Discuss the results with the DATA DRIVE team.



Community engagement and feedback

- Pre-assessments planning workshop with 8
 ECD principals
- Daily check-in with the assessor
- Identified key info with Data Drive and Linda
 Biersteker to share with ECD Forum
- Assessor presented results to 75 ECD Forum members – feedback loops
- Platform for ECD Forum members to share their responses, recommendations, practices





How we used the data

Addressing the low scores in the three FALLING BEHIND areas.

- 1. Emergent Numeracy and Maths In 2024 we selected Book Dash books with content on numeracy and maths concepts and provided training and resources for practitioners and parents.
- 2. Fine Motor Coordination and Visual-Motor Integration Provided more training and resources for practitioners to promote drawing, cutting, pasting, creativity, etc.
- 3. Cognition and Executive Function We are looking for a programme/ways to to build these skills (possibly partner with Singakwenza).

Plans

Funda Engadini (Learning in the garden) programme for 4-5 year olds
Lulamaphiko's nature-based curriculum.
Planning ELOM pre and post assessments to support the programme's development.
